


The function centre is a 5-minute drive from the championship venue.




Men's Kyu Individuals




Women's Kyu Individuals




Men's Dan Individuals



Women's Dan Individuals




Veterans' Individuals




Men's Kyu Teams


Women's Kyu Teams








Women's Dan Teams

About Kendo

What is Kendo?

The word kendo literally means 'The Way of the Sword' (ken: sword + do: way), and can best be described as Japanese Fencing. Kendo's origins are most closely associated with the feudal Japanese Samurai and many protocols within today's dojos still reflect this cultural tradition. Kendo has now become a popular sport form that is suitable for both men and women of all ages, who practice and compete together.

The Concept of Kendo

The Concept of Kendo is to discipline the human character through the application of the principles of the katana (Japanese sword).

The Purpose of Practicing Kendo is:

To mould the mind and body.

To cultivate a vigorous spirit,

And through correct and rigid training,

To strive for improvement in the art of Kendo.

To hold in esteem human courtesy and honour.

To associate with others with sincerity.

And to forever pursue the cultivation of oneself.

This will make one be able:

To love his/her country and society.

To contribute to the development of culture


And to promote peace and prosperity among all peoples.



Scoring a Point in Kendo

There are 5 elements required to make a valid strike in kendo (Yuko Datotsu).

- 1. Correct posture must be maintained. The body, correct upright posture and relaxed.
- 2. The correct target must be struck. Men (head), kote (wrist), do (chest) or tsuki (throat).
- 3. The correct part of shinai must be used. Datotsu-bu is the area above the nakayui and below the tip of the shinai and must be the only part of the shinai to strike the target.
- 4. Clear intention. Striking only the area intended to be struck.
- 5. Zanshin must be present. After the strike the attacker must show strong follow through and present strong kame.
